Parent plants

Golden Delicious mutant.

Origin

Discovered by M.H. Reinders in Helden-Panningen, the Netherlands in 1962. Introduced in 1987.

Growth

Reasonably strong. Shoot growth.

Flowering

Mid-season. Fairly late at the long branches. Pollen quality is good. Somewhat self-tolerant.

Recommended pollinators are: Elstar, Gala, Pinova, Malus Golden Gem and Malus Golden Hornet.

Productivity

Early, regular and very good. Pruning is nearly always required. Slight tendency to biennial bearing.

Harvesting

From the end of September up to the fourth week of October.

Appearance

Medium-sized, regular in shape; fruit are green-yellow, later yellow. This mutant has a high percentage of smooth skinned fruits (no coarse skins) when compared to the standard Golden Delicious.

Quality

Fruit flesh is reasonable firm and is mildly sour in taste, at the end almost sweet.

Storage life

Up to mid January, in ULO-storage up to the end of June. Shelf life is good.
